

NO BOND!

The Town of Addison should not ask the citizens of Addison to go further into debt for an additional \$58 million for 40 years to fund:

- \$36M for a new Cavanaugh Flight Museum (with no guarantee as to what it will contain)
- \$22M to more than double the size of the Watertower Theater, when the average attendance is only 65% of the current 200 seats.

Councilmen Todd Meier and Dennis Kraft voted against this bond.

We cannot afford this! Not now, with the economic problems we are all facing. These are not necessary expenses and simply do not benefit the citizens of Addison commensurate to the cost. The only source of income to repay the bond is an increase in our property taxes. If this bond proposal passes, Addison cannot achieve a balanced budget for 2009. The Council has already agreed to invest \$29.5 million in the new Vitruvian development on Marsh Lane, without submitting it to the citizens for a vote, and we are getting a .4337% increase in our property taxes just to repay that. The additional debt incurred would bring the total debt for the last 12 months to \$88 million!
